Did you know that nearly half of all Whatcom County households cannot afford the basics to get by in our community?

Every day, individuals and families throughout Whatcom County are forced to make impossible decisions, like whether to feed their children or keep the lights on, or whether to put gas in the car or fill a prescription. For many of these households, saving isn't an option. Despite working hard, many of our friends and neighbors live paycheck to paycheck, just one unexpected expense away from disaster.

Often, these hardworking households need help in more than one area to get to a stable place.

- Each year, over 50,000 people are touched by United Way funded services.
- Since United Way introduced Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to Whatcom County in 2022, 7,300 local children have received monthly books in the mail at no cost to families (that's nearly 150,000 books in the hands of local kids!).
